






MISSION STATEMENT




The **ANCHORS FOR LIFE FOUNDATION** simply began with a phone conversation between Michael Gustin and Juneria Berges, Ed.D. on June 9, 2011. After catching up with each other's past endeavors and family, the discussion quickly progressed to the vital needs of our youth and how we could be involved in providing life's essential skills and traits for our children of today who quickly become the leaders of tomorrow. Juneria reflected upon her first days as the principal of a middle school categorized by the school district as the "least likely school in the district" to be successful. She shared her depth of gratitude for the Gustin family's creation, devotion and funding of the WIN FOR LIFE FOUNDATION (1992-1996). Because of the teacher training, curriculum and consumables provided for the students and parents, an exceptional positive difference was made in this middle school which

directly affected all aspects of academic achievement and the school culture. The students, teachers, parents and community rose together as a TEAM and after only one and one-half vears the school was named the first National Blue Ribbon School in the district. Prior to concluding the conversation, Mike scheduled a meeting in early July to address the possibilities of moving forward in the creating of another foundation to address the issues facing our children today.

At the meeting, which occurred on July 4, 2011, Mike and Juneria met with three additional devoted philanthropic citizens who shared their sincere interest and desire to be involved in some manner. Together the decision was made to pursue the formation of a new foundation with the first step focusing on utilizing the previously successfully methods.

On July 5, 2011, research was conducted on the Texas Secretary of State site for name availability and ANCHORS FOR LIFE FOUNDATION was reserved. During July and August, the small board of directors met four times. Beginning in September through December the

professionals.


On January 16, 2012, one board member and Juneria attended the Lions Quest Training in Ada, Oklahoma at the invitation of PDG (Past District Governor) Lion Anthony (Tony) Dowell. On February 7, PDG Tony Dowell and Juneria attended the Ada Lions Club weekly meeting and following met and agreed upon forming a

partnership that enabled both entities to be in a win/win relationship. Soon following, Tony and Juneria met with the superintendent of Wewoka Public School District on March 12, and the superintendent shared

> his interest in acquiring Lions Quest. Within a few weeks the decision to move forward was made by the superintendent and principal of Wewoka Middle School. Teacher training was arranged for July 30 and 31 with

fourteen teachers representing grades 5 - 8 and two administrators. With a marvelous Lions Quest trainer, curriculum for each participant, and consumables for the students ordered and ready for delivery, the attendees shared two funfilled days of professional learning time for the generating of new ideas, and team building. Yea! The first of many schools to come!!



In August 2012, the **ANCHORS FOR LIFE FOUNDATION** website (www.anchorsforlifefounda tion.org) was created with the continuous commitment to expand and perfect. On September 8, 2012, Juneria made the first contact with Dime Box Independent School District (ISD) in Dime Box, Texas. The **Executive Director met** with the superintendent and principal on September 20. Both were very excited about the program. Following the meeting Juneria made a presentation to the Dime Box Board of Trustees. Within three days an affirmative response was received and the training

date of January 21, 2013 was secured with Lions Quest International. The elementary curriculum training was focused on pre-kindergarten through fifth grade teachers and grades 6-12 teachers focused their learning on the adolescent curriculum.

On November 7, Juneria traveled to Wewoka Middle School and met with the principal to provide professional support, encouragement, answer any questions, and get further acquainted with the teachers, administrators, and students. The principal shared that during the 2012-13 school year the curriculum was being utilized in grades 5 – 7.

During the month of January 2013, AFLF created an information brochure, supportive forms, and letterhead stationery. Also the chairperson of the Board of Directors and Executive Director talked with the Vice President District Governor in the Fort Worth area (consisting of 70 clubs) to discuss and request her support. She responded affirmatively and looked forward to our talking in the near future. In addition, following the training on January 21 for Dime Box ISD, Juneria traveled to help the principal of Dime Box develop a middle school master schedule, as well as a high school master schedule.

On April 18, 2013, Mike Gustin and Juneria shared a conference call with the manager of Lions Quest International and the Training and Program Development Director. Following the conversation, all parties agreed to compile a proposal for the formation of a strategic alliance agreement which would create a win/win relationship. The process progressed beautifully.

On July 23, an initial contact was made with the first appointed Prevention Services Counselor serving





in a most successful school district in the Dallas/Fort Worth area. She was extremely impressed with the curriculum and materials, and in August attended the training in Dime Box, TX. Upon return, she shared the training experience and was assured that the district would support a small pilot program under her leadership.

In the beginning of August, the recently approved **AFLF** Director of Development, Executive Director, and Mike Gustin met in the Lions Club International Facility in Oak Brook, Illinois with Matt Kiefer, Penny Willis, and the President of Kimbia, Mr. Dan Gillette (www.kimbia.com). The intent of the meeting was for a face-to-face discussion, sharing of additional information regarding the needs of all parties concerned and the



A meeting was held on September 10 with the high school principal and associate principal of Brazosport High School with negotiations underway. The number of students attending this high school is 3,628. Both of the administrators shared that they would collaborate with the administrative team and teacher leaders to consider all of the variables and notify the Executive Director of the decision. Approximately two weeks later, the school affirmatively replied and the Lions Quest Training was scheduled for August 19 and 20, 2014. The administrators stated that the consensus of the leadership team was to launch Lions Quest schoolwide (grade 9 - 12) during the 2014-2015 school year.
